## Guidelines on Tuition Waiver for Overseas Compatriot Students at National Changhua University of Education

Approved by Administrative Meeting on Apr.7, 2004 Approved by Administrative Meeting on Oct.1, 2008

- 1. The Guidelines was regulated to take care of overseas compatriot students during their study at our university.
- 2. The overseas compatriot students who hold indigent status and meet one of the following requirements are eligible for application.
  - a) being recommended overseas or assigned through an entrance exam with a register record:
  - b) being assigned through an exam system in Hong Kong or Macao with a register record;
  - c) being referred to educational authorities by Overseas Community Affairs Council with a register record after arriving at Taiwan;
  - d) being recommended by a partner university of our school and have successfully enrolled. All applicants (except for those have a register record in MOE) shall attach a Chinese version of low-income status certificate issued by their local authorities.
- 3. The overseas compatriot students who have one of the following situations are not allowed to file an application.
  - a) having been sponsored by the government;
  - b) having been punished by one minor demerit or more at school;
  - c) having committed a crime and being sentenced by court without commutation to fine or probation.
- 4. Those who are not allowed to file an application due to the situations described as Section 3-b or 3-c of the Guidelines above shall retrieve their eligibility in the next semester after reforming their misconduct and behaving well after being evaluated and approved by Student Affairs Meeting of our school.
- 5. For application, freshmen shall file an application to Office of Student Affairs (OSA) within one month after the first semester commences; the existing students shall do this according to OSA's announcement before the end of previous semester.
- 6. The waiver of tuition and miscellaneous fees shall be cancelled or returned if the granted overseas compatriot students have one of the following situations:
  - a) having suspended, transferred or withdrawn from school within 45 days (included) since the semester commences:
  - b) having situations described as Section 3-b or 3-c of the Guidelines above during their study at our school;
  - c) The number of year for enjoying tuition waiver shall be based on the legal year of study regulated by the educational system of our school (the years for extended study are not included). An application during extended study with a good reason can be treated as a special case and submitted for approval.
  - d) having been retained for another year of study, studying a minor, or making up a course (on education extension).
- 7. The granted students who suspend from school for some reasons are eligible for application after returning to the school.
- 8. The amount of waiver shall be one third of overall tuition and miscellaneous fees.

- 9. The expenditure of waiver shall be funded by annual budget of "Subsidies for Student's Study" of our university.
- 10. The Guidelines shall go into effect after being approved by Administrative Meeting and ratified by President. The same procedure shall be applied to the amendments likewise.
