

Regulations on Study-work Subsidy for Overseas Compatriot Students at National Changhua University of Education

Regulated and Revised on May 2, 2007

1. The Regulations was formulated pursuant to “Guidelines on Subsidizing Part-time On-campus Employment for Overseas Compatriot Students” by Overseas Community Affairs Council (OCAC).
2. The target receiver of this subsidy is set to be the overseas compatriot students or the students from Hong Kong and Macao who are studying at a senior high school or a school at higher educational level in Taiwan in accordance with "Regulations Regarding Study and Counseling Assistance for Overseas Chinese Students in Taiwan" or “Regulations for Hong Kong and Macao Residents Studying in Taiwan”. Those who hold an indigent status will be prioritized.
The overseas compatriot students with indigent status shall be verified by one of the following conditions:
 - a) An overseas financial proof or certificate of indigent status is provided;
 - b) If parents have settled down in Taiwan, a verified exemption certificate of individual income tax for the last year; or a photocopy of household annual income list issued by taxation authorities shall be provided.
 - c) Overseas compatriot students’ living conditions in Taiwan.
3. The overseas compatriot students with indigent status who have any of the following records shall not file an application:
 - a) having been granted the subsidies and other scholarships or financial aids;
 - b) failing to pass the evaluations for their study-work performance in the last semester.
 - c) being punished by one major demerit or more in the last semester.
 - d) committing a crime and being sentenced by court without commutation to fine or probation.
 - e) being in the status of suspension, withdrawal or expulsion from school.
4. All applications will be evaluated by Office of Student Affairs while the quota and amount of the grants are arranged in accordance with the related regulations of OCAC in that academic year.
5. Applications shall be submitted to Guidance and Counseling Section, Office of Student Affairs within one week after each academic year commences.
6. The subsidized overseas compatriot students’ study shall not be affected by the arrangements of study-work.
7. The Regulations shall go into effect after being ratified by President and filed in OCAC for reference. The same procedure shall be applied to the amendments likewise.
